"As an artist I am particularly interested in the tension between **nature and culture**, between **tradition and innovation**.

I try to push the limits of digital possibilities, while maintaining respect for the (art) historical **legacy**. When creating a work, I investigate the possibilities between the organic and the digital, between the **virtual and the physical**.

I explore classical themes such as **man** (with a focus on the anatomy and the emergence of cyborgs), **plants** (especially their genetic manipulation), **masks** and **animals**, always starting from an (art) historical background that I cut with **contemporary pop and sci-fi culture**."

INTRODUCTION

Fostering a **cross-pollination between the digital and the physical**, Nick Ervinck (°1981, Belgium) explores the boundaries between various media. Studio Nick Ervinck applies tools and techniques from **new media**, in order to explore the aesthetic potential of sculpture, 3D prints installation, architecture and design.

Through his divergent practice, a strong **fascination with the construction of space** is noticeable. Not only does Nick Ervinck focus on the autonomous sculptural object, he also questions its spatial positioning and points to the phenomenological **experience and embodiment of space**. Ervinck's work, in short, oscillates between the static and the dynamic, prospecting new virtual or utopian territories.

His work has been acquired by art collectors around the world and shown in solo and group exhibitions at NRW-Forum Düsseldorf; Ars Electronics, Linz; MARTa, Herford; Paul Valéry Museum, Sète; Fenaille Museum, Rodez; Laboral, Gijon; Museum Beelden aan Zee, Scheveningen; Bozar, Brussels; Brakke Grond, Amsterdam; S.M.A.K., Ghent; Gallo-Roman Museum, Tongeren; Museum Dr. Guislain, Ghent; Vanhaerents Art Collection, Brussels; Museum M, Leuven; the Museum of Fine Arts, Ghent and the Middelheim Museum, Antwerp.

Outside Europe, Ervinck took his first steps with group exhibitions in UNArt Center, Shanghai; MOCA, Shanghai; Axiom, Tokyo; Oya Stone Mine, Tokyo; Northern Arizona University Art Museum, Flagstaff and Chamber, New York. In 2019, at the request of the City Council of St. Petersburg, Florida, he was commissioned to create a public sculpture in bronze, OLNETOPIA. In 2020, he was asked by the Chinese government to create ALUNIK for the Shenzhen World Conventions & Exhibition Center. In 2021, a large solo museum exhibition was planned for him in Häme Castle, organized by the National Museum of Finland. In addition to some 50 works inside and outside, a new monumental installation was also presented there. A voluminous monograph was also published in response to this exhibition.

Nick Ervinck lives in Lichtervelde with his wife Kaat and their three children, Lene, Ida and Thor.

STATEMENT

I have always been fascinated by how art has developed due to **new materials** and techniques. Somewhat disappointed at contemporary sculpture and it's lack of renewal, I turned towards architecture, applied sciences and New Media, in order to elaborate a new language, and to compose forms and designs that were unthinkable before.

My aim is to **let architecture and sculpture meet**, and to explore the realm of the impossible by constantly pushing the limits of what we call 'realistic'. The studio takes a vanguard position in the field of **digital technology** (such as 3D technology and computational design methods). 3D printing has the incredible advantage to produce almost any type of intricate geometry or ornament.

Moreover, my images balance on the edge of functionality, spatial interventions, digital aesthetics and **object-oriented eclecticism**. Using copy paste techniques in a 3D software environment, I derive images, shapes and textures from different sources: basilicas, corals, dinosaurs, cottages, Rorschach inkblots, Chinese rocks and trees, manga, twelfth-century floral wallpaper, fauna and flora, anatomical parts,... Simultaneously, my work holds numerous **references to the tradition of sculpture**, (such as the work of Hans Arp, Henry Moore or Barbara Hepworth) and to architecture (think of Greg Lynn, who introduced the blob as an architectural constructive principle).

My work lends itself very well to **commissions**, because it reflects on space and the relationship between people, nature, tradition and technological innovation. My work is intentionally created and placed so that it becomes an essential **part of the context**.

Secondly, my work contributes to the **positive image** of the surrounding and buildings. Because of the recognizable visual language of my sculptures, they can function as meeting point or **landmark**. I am convinced that my work contributes to the quality of life of the community. By using a bright colour palette, I try to design a cheerful perspective on modern society that gives people a warm feeling.

My artistic practice is largely geared towards **outdoor sculptures and integrated art**. In the past few years, I've built up extensive professional expertise in this field, which I hope to develop even more in the future.
























